Bishop Creek Water Association Annual Meeting Summary March 14, 2017

I. Opening and Introductions

The BCWA meeting was opened at 7:03 p.m. Trustees in attendance included: Gene Coufal, Merry Armstrong, Greg Loveland and Don Kunze. Trustee Henry Means was absent. Watermaster, Chas Coufal was in attendance as well.

II. Approval of the January 30, 2017 Annual Meeting Summary

The summary of the January 30, 2017 annual meeting was reviewed and approved as written.

III. Financial Report

The Financial Report for January and February 2017 were reviewed and approved unanimously.

IV. Election of Board Officers

The Board of Trustees elected officers for the 2017 year as follows:

- a) President: Gene Coufal
- b) Secretary: Greg Loveland
- c) Treasurer: Henry Means
- V. Appointment of the Finance, and the Water and Arbitration Committee Chairs Don Kunze was nominated and elected by the Board as the Water and Arbitration Committee chair. Don will submit names to the board for consideration to be on the committee.

President Gene Coufal appointed Merry Armstrong to head up the Finance Committee. Merry will submit names to Gene for appointment to the committee.

VI. Bishop Creek Precipitation, Flow and Storage Reports

Greg Loveland discussed the current precipitation conditions (see attached precipitation chart). Burt Almond reported that SCE is forecasting 100,000 acre feet of runoff in the Bishop Creek Drainage this year. A normal year has a runoff of 53,000 AF. Gene Coufal also reported that per SCE flows at plant 6 can be expected in the range of 150 to 200 cfs now through the beginning of snow melt/runoff starting.

VII. Watermaster Report

Watermaster Chas Coufal reported that plugged culverts and flooding have become more prevalent, specifically:

- Manor Market Area (Laurel Street): BCWA will work with the Inyo County Road Department to clear street culvert;
- McLaren Area on Ranch Road: worked with Inyo County Road Dept to clear street culvert (third time);
- Sierra and Crosby Streets: worked with City of Bishop to clear street culvert
- North Sierra Highway: Harry Matlick Ditch through Early Ponds area flooding onto Sierra Highway;
- Coons Art Gallery: flooding of Gallery property working with LADWP and landowners to correct;

- J Diamond Mobile Home Park: worked with LADWP A&Rs to correct flooding problem
- Bishop Plaza ditch diversion vaults have not been cleaned in years. A vacuum truck (City of Bishop) is scheduled to fix the problems on Thursday, March 16.

Chas distributed a copy (attached) of a standard note that he has been leaving when a member is not home and he needs to do some work unplugging a ditch or culvert blockage, etc., to let them know he was in their yard and had to do some maintenance.

Chas reported that he received 82 phone calls from January to March 14th. Those calls consisted of; 18 from DWP / Board Members and 64 from members. Chas also received 71 text messages through the same time period.

Chas encouraged members to leave clear detailed voice messages. He also requested that the membership keep their ditches clean to prevent flooding with the expected high runoff.

VIII. Old Business

- a) Collection of Past Due Assessments: Gene Coufal reported that the next step is to take members to small claims court to collect past dues. Gene reported that it is expected that 5 members will be taken to small claims court within 60 days.
- b) Ditch Diversion Box Repair/Rebuild Work: Gene reported that no work has been done but expects a report to membership in the next few months.
- c) Reinhackle Ditch: Greg Loveland reported that the head walls have been poured and the materials are ready for install. Labor to perform the work is scarce due to the preparations being made for the high runoff. Greg will report the status at the next meeting.

IX. New Business

- a) Policy Regarding Shutting Off of Ditches: In response to a variety of requests of the Watermaster to shut ditches off for maintenance work there was a discussion about the need for a policy regarding shutting off ditches to guide the Watermaster. A discussion of the pros and cons of a policy took place. In general the comments from the membership varied. Some members suggested that there should be no official policy and that cases should be handled on a case by case basis. Trustee Don Kunze requested that the issue be tabled until next meeting for further discussion and thought. Item was tabled.
- b) Other (Members in good standing): Todd Vogel discussed the high ground water issue on Highland Dr. He stated that high ground water continues to be an issue for his property. He advocates that the neighborhood should responsibly work together to find a solution. He indicated that running the North and South Highland Ditches had an impact on his monitoring wells and caused an increase within days. Todd has dug a French drain to dewater his property.

Todd suggested that he BCWA can assist by:

- Communicating the points of the DWR Report to the membership;
- Encouraging the "Ron Approach" to street ground water monitoring; and
- Encouraging the membership to line ponds as a protection of the neighborhood

Todd agreed to draft a letter containing these points for the Board to consider.

X. Next Meeting

The next meeting of the Bishop Creek Water Association will be on Tuesday, April 11, 2017 at 7 pm at the Los Angeles Department and Water Power Office Building at 300 Mandich St.

XI. Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 8:57 p.m.
