1. Opening and Introduction

BWCA meeting called to order 7:03 pm. Trustees in attendance: Merry Armstrong, Gene Coufal, Don Kunze, Eric Tillemans and Mark Frumkin. Watermaster Matt Durkee was present.

2. Acceptance of the Monthly Board Meeting Summary for October 10, 2023

The October 10th, 2023, meeting summary was accepted as written.

3. Approval of the October 2023 Financial Report

The financial report for October 2023 was approved unanimously.

4. Bishop Creek Precipitation, Flow, and Storage Report

SCE has been holding Bishop Creek outflow steady at around 85 cfs.







Re: Inyo County Culvert Policy

It has come to the Board's attention, that the Inyo County Road Department is taking the position that the Road Department is no longer responsible for the maintenance of neighborhood street culverts. Historically, Inyo County has maintained the culverts since they provide an essential part of street flood control. The catch-basins scattered throughout the area are, in most cases, directly linked to a culvert that conveys the water to a larger conveyance and eventually East to Department of Water and Power facilities. Case in point, the replacement of the culvert across Sierra Vista Way at Barlow Lane and repair of the culvert across Glenbrook Way and Barlow Lane that was undertaken by Inyo County Public Works. These projects were performed fairly recently, within the last 10 years. The responsibility of flood control, dewatering county roads, and maintaining safe road transportation has always been overseen by the County, as it is done in most other jurisdictions.

The argument that the primary function of the culverts is for the Bishop Creek Water Association is misleading in as much as, prior to the formation of the BCWA, most of the land that has been subdivided was originally used for agricultural businesses that were flood irrigated with the excess water conveyed through ditches and culverts. In addition, there are adverse impacts as a result of the position the County has taken that property owners, immediately upstream and downstream of a street culvert, are responsible for maintenance to the center of the street. It is not practical nor economical to have home owners (or contractors hired by them) excavate ditches, replace culverts, and backfill ditches to desired compaction, and then repave these areas.

This position directly affects the Sierra Highlands CSD as we own property at the corner of Barlow and Glenbrook with an adjoining culvert immediately downstream, making the District responsible for maintenance of that culvert. The District does not have the resources, the expertise, or the authority from our current insurance provider, to involve itself in the care and maintenance of such a structure. The District operates three (3) wells, two (2) hydro-pneumatic tanks, and a distribution system that provides reliable potable water to some 217 residences in West Bishop. Also, the District has a Board of five (5) Directors, a part-time General Manager and part-time Secretary, none of whom is equipped to evaluate the integrity of the culvert or to become involved in the unplugging or the cleaning of the culvert.

Of equal concern is the position stated by the County that adjacent property owners are responsible for clearing culverts to the center of the street. This position leads to the question: Is the individual property owner also responsible for the integrity of the paved street adjoining their parcel and replacement of the paving when necessary? We, as a Board, are of the opinion that it is County government's responsibility to provide flood control and maintain all structures, including catch-basins and culverts, necessary for effecting that purpose. Again, following precedent set in the past, the local government, i.e., Inyo County, is the agency with the capability and therefore, the responsibility to undertake this commitment.

Our community members have put trust in the District to provide reliable potable water year after year. Any distractions from our primary function, such as inspecting and maintaining culverts, would potentially impact our water delivery service. In addition, any costs and liability associated with this activity would further strain the District's financial resources, thereby seriously compromising the ability to supply and distribute water. The County has more information about these existing culverts and is better equipped to perform whatever maintenance is required.

In closing, the Board of Directors of SHCSD, on behalf of all their members, are registering a strong protest to Inyo County's position of making adjacent property owners responsible for the ongoing functional condition of a culvert. Our Board is available to meet with you for discussions and clarification.
