



Subject: Street Culvert Clearing and Responsibility

Dear Bishop Creek Water Association Members,

It has been brought to the Bishop Creek Water Association (BCWA) Board that the street culvert between your properties is again plugged, significantly reducing the amount of water that the culvert can carry. This has a serious impact on BCWA members upstream and downstream of the culvert. This culvert has been a problem over the years due to mainly sediment accumulation. Beginning about five years ago the Inyo County Road Department (ICRD) took the position that they can no longer assist the BCWA in unplugging and replacing deteriorated street culverts. Previously these problems were dealt with cooperatively. This new position has left the Water Association in a quandary. The BCWA does not own assets in the ditch water distribution system, other than water control structures for water control purposes. The BCWA By-Laws Article X, Section 3 provides:

"All boxes, headgates or diversion works diverting water from any main ditch or channel, regardless of by whom installed, shall for all water control purposes be deemed and considered the property of the association. The association reserves the right to exclusively control and regulate water at all boxes, regardless of by whom the same may have been installed..."

In the past, recognizing the need to provide water to upstream and downstream water using members, the BCWA worked cooperatively with the ICRD to unplug and replace culverts. Despite numerous attempts by the BCWA Board of Trustees, Inyo County has not been willing to change from this newly taken position. This has been discussed at the highest levels of Inyo County government.

At this time, since the ICRD will no longer cooperatively participate, it falls on the BCWA and its members to resolve issues with culverts to keep water flowing in ditches as required by the court ordered Chandler Decree. The details have yet to be worked out, but it appears that for now, the BCWA will have to be entirely responsible for maintenance and replacement of culverts conveying Bishop Creek water. With regards to plugged street culverts, regardless of Inyo County's position on assisting with plugged street culverts, the BCWA By-Laws make it clear that the responsibility for keeping ditches clean and clear of debris is the responsibility of the property owner. With the above exception, property owners are responsible for all effects,

operations, and maintenance of the ditches on their property. The result of this is the keeping of debris from entering and plugging downstream street culverts. Below are some of the pertinent sections from the BCWA By-Laws that apply in this situation. Article IX, Sections 4 and 5 provides:

"Each member shall keep his ditches free and clear of debris (sand, silt, rocks, grass, weeds, and trash) so that water, including waste water, may move for the beneficial use of members below. "

"In the event the equitable distribution of water is impeded or interfered with causing flooding, wastage or other detriment to the flow of water to occur by reason of the refusal, inability or neglect of any member or members to remedy the same, the association may, after due notice, have the remedial work performed and the responsible member or members shall be billed therefor, at the cost of the work."

ARTICLE XII, Section 2, items 3-6 provide:

"As a homeowner and member of the BCWA you are responsible for the impact of your own action or lack of action in managing water flowing on your property."

"As a member of the BCWA you are responsible to maintain the ditches and pipes on your property. This maintenance includes the removal of weeds, leaves, and trash ..."

"If you do not properly maintain the ditches and pipes on your property, the BCWA may arrange to have the work done at your expense..."

"Be aware that many factors, including runoff, freezing, irrigation patterns, and fall leaves, can significantly affect the amount of water flowing to your property. You should expect the flow in your ditches to vary, and your ditches and pipes should be sized, designed, and maintained to carry the maximum possible flows without flooding."

The most effective means of keeping debris from plugging street culverts is for property owners immediately upstream of street culverts to install and maintain grates at the culvert inlet to restrict leaves, twigs, and debris from entering the culvert, and downstream property owners to keep street culvert outlets free of obstructions, accumulating sand, and debris so that water exits free and clear without restriction. This will create additional work, but in the long run, it should alleviate a lot of headaches, work, and cost due to plugged street culverts. As it is the case with any ditch, where the BCWA relies on each property owner to do their part, street culverts will need to be handled similarly (pertinent BCWA By-Laws sections are ARTICLE IX, Sections 4 and 5, and ARTICLE XII, Section 2, items 3-6).

As provided in the BCWA By-Laws, if a street culvert becomes plugged, it is the responsibility of the upstream property owner if it is plugged with leave/debris and there is no mechanism in place to catch the debris. And likewise, if the flow leaving the culvert is obstructed in any way, it is the responsibility of the downstream property owner. As provided in Article IX, Section 5 (see above) to ensure an equitable distribution of water to all members, if the BCWA must get involved in clearing a downstream culvert, the upstream and/or downstream property owner would be assessed the cost of the culvert clearing.

As property owners with a street culvert between your properties, it is most important that you pay close attention to these guidelines. In the current situation the BCWA Board has decided to pay the cost of having the Eastern Sierra Community Service District clear the culvert. In the future, this cost may be assessed against the property owners if grating and an open free flowing culvert exit is not maintained. A September 20, 2023, letter from the BCWA Board was sent to membership regarding this issue, a copy is enclosed.

In conclusion, regardless of Inyo County's position on assisting with plugged/deteriorated street culverts, we the members of the BCWA need to comply with the responsibilities of the BCWA Articles and By-Laws. For the benefit of all members, property owners need to maintain a clean, clear, unencumbered ditch flowing through and leaving their property. If your property is immediately upstream of a street culvert a grate should be installed and maintained at the culvert inlet. If your property is immediately downstream of a street culvert the outlet of your culvert needs to be kept free of obstructions, accumulating sand, and debris. In the future, to ensure an equitable distribution of water to all members, if the BCWA must get involved in clearing of a street culvert, the upstream and/or downstream property owners can be assessed the cost of the work (BCWA By-Laws Article IX, Section 5).

It has been almost 2 1/2 years since the BCWA Boards approval of your ditch relocation project and our last communication (below). The BCWA Board would like an update on the progress of the ditch relocation on your property (Parcel number 011-510-27), and most specifically items 3 and 4 (relocation of the water control box and dedication of a 10-foot easement to the BCWA for the new location) in my March 30, 2022, email (below).

You have dug a new ditch, and the ditch water currently flows in the newly relocated ditch without a control structure. This has created a potentially hazardous situation. A misfortunate event upstream could result in the uncontrolled release of water down the newly relocated ditch, causing significant property damage downstream. If items 3 and 4 above are not dealt with in a timely manner we will be forced to restore the ditch flow to the historic channel (which has a water control structure installed). Per BCWA By-Laws, Article IX, Section 5 (below) you would be responsible for cost of that work.:

"In the event the equitable distribution of water is impeded or interfered with causing flooding, wastage or other detriment to the flow of water of water to occur by reason of the refusal, inability or neglect of any member or members to remedy the same, the association may, after due notice, have the remedial work performed and the responsible member or members shall be billed therefor, at the cost of the work. "

We have a BCWA Board meeting on August 13 and would appreciate a communication on the status of the above work before then. Thanks Gene

Eric, at its last monthly Board meeting, the Board approved your ditch relocation design as long as it complies with the BCWA Articles and By-Laws (see especially Article XII) with a few specific reminders/restrictions that are provided for in the Articles and By-Laws. Specifically: 1) the capacity of your proposed ditch system needs to minimally be able to convey the same amount of water as the existing alignment; 2) the ponds comply with the limitations (no more than 5 feet deep and lined- verified by the Watermaster) as provide for in Article XI; 3) the control box on the Bypass Ditch that you plan to relocate will need to be designed to facilitate a BCWA lock and will be controlled by the Watermaster (Article X); and 4) also the rerouted ditch needs to have a 10 foot easement dedicated to the BCWA (Article XII, Section 2, item 13). This approval will be documented in the BCWA Board meeting summary for March 8, 2022, which you will be able to find on the BCWA website (BishopCreekWater.org). Hi Gene,

Thanks for your help on the stream modification... Sorry I'm a bit late getting this over to you... I tested positive for Covid last week, and I've been extremely tired for the last few days! Here is my very basic drawing depicting my idea to modify the stream on our lot on Carol Lane. We basically would like to relocate the existing flow gate and stream to the south part of the lot, and through a combination of surface streams and underground pipes, rejoin the existing set of pipes that flow across the utility district lot, so the water will exit the property using the existing piping that is already in place. In order to avoid clogs, I think it makes sense to use a concrete box to

transition from the new 16" pipe to the existing 8" pipes with an open drain grate for easy inspection and cleaning if necessary. Let me know if you have questions or comments.
